

Summary of UNC Profile: Key Trend and Accountability Data (Alan Mabe) Based on: Key Trend and Accountability Data for UNC system institutions (November 2010)

This 61 page report is a collection of core university system data from 2000 to 2009, presented in tables and graphs, along with a short analysis and explanations of each section. It attempts to identify core areas and provide key trend and accountability data and to set the data in context and provide explanations to help the reader understand it. The idea is to use data to try to develop optimal ways to connect admissions decisions and student and campus performance.

The areas included are:

- enrollment trends (by residency, diversity, minority growth, DE, age, transfer students)
- retention rates (Freshmen to Sophomore),
- graduation rates (4-year, 6 year, CC transfers)
- degree production (degrees conferred by level and field of study, institution (+ high-need))
- economic Impact (inclusion of Walden report data)
- tuition (by institution, + fees, compared to peers)
- financial aid (by institution, % of students, by parental income, source, indebtedness)
- faculty (by institution, diversity, research productivity, sponsored program activity)
- utilization of facilities (sq. ft per stud. +fac., capacity/enroll. ratio, classroom occup., lab occup.)
- endowments (market value, % increase)
