DESCRIPTION

This course explores the intersection of **human, animal, and environmental health** and facilitates the understanding of health as an inexorably linked system requiring multidisciplinary collaborative efforts. The **One Health** concept demonstrates the importance of a holistic approach to disease prevention and the maintenance of human, animal, and environmental health. Co-listed at **Duke** and **UNC** to promote cross-campus and cross-discipline interactions, this discussion-based seminar course is taught through a mix of guest lectures by experts in One Health and global health, panel discussions, and collaborative case studies. Graduate and professional students from any discipline interested in **interconnected health challenges** are encouraged to enroll.
