

UNDERGRADUATE MINOR OF GLOBAL ONE HEALTH

DESCRIPTION

The **Global One Health minor** is a 15-credit program exploring the interconnections between **human, animal, plant, and environmental health**. Students employ interdisciplinary perspectives and systems thinking to key Global One Health issues including emerging **infectious diseases**, challenges to sustainable **food and water** sources, and **climate change** and related **health disparities**.

The minor offers flexibility in course selection, catering to various interests and career goals in Global One Health. Through a curriculum that includes foundational courses, specialized electives, and experiential learning opportunities, students will gain **critical skills** and experience to address **complex global challenges**.
