Guide for Students on the Ethical Use of Generative Al Tools

Can be used as a guide for students to evaluate the use of AI in your course

To be an ethical user of AI tools, I must ask the following questions...

Before)	
1	How and why am I going to use the tool? (To replace or enhance?) - I use the AI tool to enhance my learning and creativity, not to replace it: - I use the AI tool for rote or procedural skills - I use the AI tools when they are appropriate (see above) and not as a means to complete work at the last minute	
2	Have I been given permission to use the tool in that context? I use the Al tool only when it has been explicitly allowed by the instructor, and do not assume that it is permitted in all contexts: When I am unsure if Al tool use is permitted, I seek clarification from my instructors	
3	Is my intention to learn or to just get a grade? - I reflect on my use of the AI tool throughout the process: - I seek to understand how it enhanced my learning - I seek to understand how it limited my learning	
4	Do I know how to use the tool? I understand the tool's capabilities and limitations, as well as the terms, conditions, and privacy policies associated with the tool.	
5	Do I understand the strengths and limitations of the tool? - I treat generative AI output as a secondary source of information that is not always accurate and take steps to critically evaluate its output: □ I attribute ideas and products to their original author or source, □ I check all AI output for accuracy by doing an external

1	Are there other ways to do this WITHOUT AI tools?	
2	Is the output biased? Is the output accurate (or is it hallucinating)?	
3	Is there a better prompt? Can I ask a different or better question?	
4	Am I acquiring the learning objectives of the course or assignment by using the AI tool?	
5	Where did the output come from (source, authorship)? Are the sources AI utilized accurate?	
6	Have I vetted alternative perspectives?	
7	Am I using the tool appropriately according to the instructions provided?

1	Are my original ideas present in my work?	
2	Am I spreading misinformation or perpetuating harmful ideas, biases, etc.?	
4	How did this assignment (and use of AI tools) help me advance my understanding of the content or learning objectives?	
5	Have I been transparent about my use of AI tools? - I am transparent about where, how, and why I used the tool(s): - I cite the tool(s) in my work, - I explain how I used the tool(s) in my work	

6	Have I cited original authors and sources appropriately?	
7	Have I cited my use of the AI tool appropriately?	
8	Have I plagiarized (knowingly or unknowingly)?
